## Are you Interested in supporting children and young people with SEN/D.

There are many SEN/D children and young people within Barking & Dagenham who struggle to complete everyday task, eg cooking, making their bed, brushing their teeth or going to the hairdresser.

We are looking for willing and able volunteers to assist in running groups for our children and young people at the Children and Young People Hub, from **4.15-6.15 on a Monday**.

The Group will be for 11- 17 years old SEN/D children and young people for 2 hours. This will be a mixed group (boys and girls). The group will be based at The CYPD HUB, and in the main hall.

## The group will cover a range of different themes:

Session 1 will be a food shop theme.

- Session 2 will be a bedroom theme.
- Session 3 will be a cooking theme.
- Session 4 will social engagement
- Session 5 will encourage communication.

#### We need volunteers who have:

- An interest in support SEN/D children and young people, who's opened to developing a range of different skills.
- Knowledge of basic money, (able to do shopping)
- Willingness to learn and develop new skills to work and support SEN/D children and young people.
- Volunteer will need access to a computer to ensure that the complete the recommended training provided by LBBD.
- DBS would need to be completed

- Creative and open to new ideas and approaches.

## The Volunteer will learn:

- How to support SEN/D children and young people.
- Encouraging children and young people to develop social skills.
- Demonstrating useful problem-solving, task centred and child centred approach.
