

Child Neglect Screening Tool Designed for non-Graded Care Profile 2 (GCP2) licenced practitioners


The GCP2 Screening Tool is intended for practitioners working with children and families in all partner agencies to quickly identify areas of concern which may indicate a child/young person is being neglected. If there is more than one child in the family, a GCP2 Screening Tool should be completed for each child you have concerns about.

The screening tool's purpose is to equip professionals to identify neglect at an early stage and alert the need for any further action. It is intended to complement existing Barking and Dagenham Safeguarding Children Partnership tools.

In completing the screening tool, professionals are asked to detail what they are worried about or to record what they have observed, providing clear examples in the evidence column to add context and detail to the findings. This is a concise tool to be used by all agencies including education, health, community, voluntary and faith partners. It is understood that depending on the professional's involvement with the family they may not be able to comment on all sections, however every effort must be made to capture a true picture of what life is like for the child.

The GCP2 Screening Tool should be used in all cases where neglect is suspected and will aid practitioners in deciding:

- How to apply the Barking and Dagenham Safeguarding Children Partnership's Continuum of Need
- What referral pathway should be followed and what action should be taken by the practitioner
- Whether a full Graded Care Profile 2 (GCP2) tool should be completed by a trained professional

Based on the completion of this tool, if you think a full GCP2 assessment should be conducted, you should contact your Designated Safeguarding Lead, or a GCP2 licensed practitioner within your organisation who can conduct this assessment.

Based on the completion of this screening tool, if the concerns for the child(ren) warrant a multi-agency response in line with the continuum of need, you can make referrals to the:

A copy of the completed screening tool should be provided as part of the referral, as it will support in evidencing concerns and ensure the right intervention is provided for the child and their family.

Please note: If it is an emergency, and a child or someone else is at high risk of immediate and significant harm, you should call 999 first.

The tool is not a full assessment of risk and should be used alongside the Continuum of Need document and your own safeguarding procedures.

If you have 5 or more 'Yes' answers, completion of the GCP2 is recommended to understand the lived experience of a child you are worried about and to inform professional decision making for next steps.

If you do not have a licenced GCP2 practitioner, please discuss with your organisation's Safeguarding Lead, who will support you to make the most appropriate referral as outlined in the sections above and in line with the Barking and Dagenham Safeguarding Children Partnership Continuum of Need. Remember to include the completed screening tool in any referral made.
