

# LB Barking and Dagenham Annual Residents Survey 2023 Final Results

# **Background and context**



- A decision was made to conduct the survey in-house, utilising the Council's consultation and engagement website, One Borough Voice, allowing us to ask residents more questions to gain a greater insight.
- When interpreting survey data, it is important to be aware of the wider context that shapes perceptions, as this information will be essential for identifying local solutions. For example, the cost-of-living crisis and national media reporting of crime are two factors that could influence responses.
- By implementing a new survey methodology, a comparison with previous years' surveys cannot be made.
- This year's survey (2023) will be the **baseline year** which future surveys will be compared against.

# **Fieldwork Summary**



- Letters were sent at random, but proportionately according to the population size of each Ward. The survey was also opened to all residents.
- The majority of responses were achieved from letter distribution, the Council's website advertisement, and the One Borough Voice and Council newsletters.
- Given the population of the borough, 932 responses gives us a margin of error of +/-4% at a 95% confidence interval, which is within the typically acceptable range.

# Weighting the results




- In line with best practice, the survey data has been weighted to adjust the results to more accurately represent the Borough's population.
- Without weighting, the survey sample would include an over-representation of certain groups when looking at the respondents' demographic profiles. The results would be biased towards those groups.
- To avoid this bias, an analytical weighting has been applied to the results, in line with the Borough's demographic profile, based on respondents':
  - > Age
  - > Sex
  - > Ethnicity
- The results of each survey question in this presentation have been weighted.









#### In the last 12 months, which of these local services have you used / had experience of?







#### To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements about Barking and Dagenham Council?



#### How do you find out about what's going on in your local area?











#### In the last 12 months, which three things have made the local area a good place to live?








#### In the last 12 months, which three things have you personally been most concerned about in your local area?








#### **Overall satisfaction**












#### To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements about community life?








# The Future of Barking and Dagenham
