Core Criteria for the Community Chest Grant

- 1. Equality, diversity and inclusion supporting those who are left behind or not well provided for by the current offer
- 2. Capacity building strengthening your organisation's capability to deliver projects.
- 3. Existing Social Prescribing needs how your proposal should support and compliment local social prescribing needs in Barking & Dagenham.
- 4. Evidence you would be required to show the impact of your work and share this with other organisations

Community Chest and Social Prescribing

The Community Chest for Social Prescribing is a grant programme that funds small to medium sized community groups to offer local activities, services or events that support Barking and Dagenham residents' health and well-being and increase health equity.

The aim of the fund is to support the capacity of the community sector to engage in social prescribing and to expand the offer of the existing social prescribing service in Barking & Dagenham.

What is Social Prescribing?

Social Prescribing is when health professionals in the NHS refer patients to support in the community, in order to improve their health and wellbeing through activities that will address their needs for example a social prescriber might refer someone who is isolated onto a face-to-face befriending service offered by a community group

Background

NHS North East London funds the Social Prescribing Community Chest initiative across all of the Place-based Partnerships in North East London, including Barking and Dagenham. These activities are funded by the NHS NEL ICB Health Inequalities funding and have been match funded by the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham. Grants will be available for up to £5000 per project. We are especially interested in supporting small groups with annual incomes under under £60,000 and groups working with and led by people with protected characteristics. These are age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.
